Janet called the meeting to order at 6 pm

Committee Reports:

Treasurer: Jayne gave a report of income and expenses to date (published elsewhere). Janet asked her to do a chart of income for building expenses for the next meeting.

Correspondence: Cheryl sent a card to Carrie Johnstone on the birth of her baby.

Agility: The agility fun run made \$150.00 per Mary and Jennifer.

Flyball: The tournament will be cancelled because a team backed out. Jeff Kulhanek didn't think it would be effective to run with only 11 teams. Staci will look into the cost of purchasing a set of lights for future tournaments.

PR: Cheryl reported that the Star City Parade application has been submitted. It will be December 2nd.

Building Issues: In Nancy's absence, Janet reported for Nancy. We need to decide on what doors we want to designate as official entrance doors. It was discussed and determined that the south glass door is the "main" entrance and will be used for Obedience classes. The glass door to the north will be used for Agility classes. We'd like to see a sign on each door.

Nancy requested that any donations for the GLOC building be cleared through her as the building chair. We have received many wonderful donations but to keep consistent with our long term goals we need to have one person in charge of accepting or declining them.

Old Business: Judy & Jayne continue to work on the nonprofit status. Progress is favorable and moving along.

New Business:

Membership Dues: Vince read the dues information in the GLOC bylaws and found that dues are due in January and we must make the proposal to change dues in October. Jayne made the motion to raise the dues to \$40 per individual and \$50 per family for 2007 effective today (10/5/06), seconded by Judy, voted, motion carried.

Website proposal: Alicia Graybill submitted a proposal to design and update the GLOC website. Alicia's proposal has been accepted. Jayne will ask Alicia to join the publicity committee.

Janet reported on the availability of mats and gates from Bellevue Dog Club. The mats are \$1.00 per linear foot, and the gates are \$20 each for 10 feet and they also have standards available. We will pass on the mats and gates at this time. Jayne reported that Goodyear will provide us with mats 3/4" thick. We will pick them up. Jayne will check into the logistics of getting them.

Elbert submitted a written request to be read in his absence. He asked if GLOC would like to offer basic and puppy classes for SCC in York. We would pay the teacher mileage at \$.41 per mile. SECC will provide the building. It was decided to let Elbert do this if he can find someone willing to drive to York to teach.

Deena from STRAY asked to sponsor dinner out with dogs similar to what she is doing at the Parthenon. November 18th will be the evening. Jayne moved to contact Deena and continue to negotiate to get 1/2 of the profits for the evening. Staci seconded, motion passed.

Kathy Platt requests help with stewards at the Council Bluffs Obedience show on November 18 and 19th. It is being held at the Events center.

Elbert also proposed that GLOC hold Business hours. In the interest of time we tabled this issue until November.

Alicia Graybill has UKC information to share with the club and requested permission to hold a "sign your dog up with UKC" event to help get dogs registered for our upcoming KC trials. This was approved.

Events Center: Sheri Wolf asked about future shows and trials at GLOC or the Events Center. Janet asked that we go with Carolyn Bailey from CKC to the Events Center to renegotiate our rates. We are currently paying \$3,000 (approx.) for the weekend. If we choose to move we have to reapply with AKC.

Jennifer and Vicky Graybill requested that the Board approve a UKC obedience trial for April 14 and 15, 2007. Mary moved to accept, Judy seconded, voted, motion passed.

Awards: Jennifer suggested nominating 5 people for the service award for 2006. Janet suggested that the club members vote. Janet brought ballots to hand out at tonight's general meeting.

Show & Go: Georgia is in charge of the October 20th show-n-go.

Fundraising: Discussion was held that anything intended to raise funds must be passed through the board. Delores Giebenrath is interested in raising funds for a building sign from her shirt sales. The Board needs to approve the sign before it is purchased.

Cheryl presented a 96 KX presentation for future advertising at \$400 a month for twenty, 15 second commercials. It was determined that this is not feasible at this time.

Staci moved to adjourn, Jayne seconded The meeting was adjourned.

The minutes of the last meeting were, moved and seconded, approved.

Treasurer's report is printed elsewhere in the Barker. There will be a new building set up cost report next month.

Correspondence: A card was to Kari Johnstone on the birth of her baby. We received a card of thanks from Great Pyrenees Rescue.

Agility: New classes will start next week. Otherwise things are going fine.

Trials: Ring stewards are needed for agility. Please be there by 7:30 a.m.

Flyball: Classes are going well. There are two new dogs and three dogs that have been having classes along. They had to cancel the last show because 12 teams are needed to be cost effective and only 11 teams were entered. They are going to check to see if they can get the timing equipment for 11 teams to be cost effective.

Public Relations: Saturday, December 2, 2006, is the Star City Parade. Red long sleeved sweatshirts need to be brought to the next meeting so that decorations can be added. You should get a sweatshirt that is a little large (must be able to wear a jacket under it). Also, black slacks (no jeans) and black shoes. This is the required uniform for walking in the parade.

Building: It has been decided that the glass door is the main entrance. A welcome sign will be put up there. Please make sure that ALL doors and windows are closed and locked. Be sure to check the white doors extra special. Also, please turn off the lights and fans. Please check with Nancy Bowen when making donations to the club. The best donation would be cash.

Old Business: No old business was discussed.

New Business: The board decided to raise the membership dues from \$20 for individuals to \$40. For the family it is going from \$25 to \$50. The activity pass is \$300 for individuals for a full year. That is \$25 per month. The family pass is \$500 with the same criteria. This is \$41.67 per month. This includes classes and drop in sessions. The Basic Class has been raised to \$60 for 6 weeks but members will receive a 25% discount or they can use the Activity Pass. Agility has been raised to \$45 for 6 weeks. Southeast Community College is allowed to send us 8 students. That

leaves 2 spots for members. If more than that sign up, a new class session will be started. The key deposit is \$120 for a full year.

Obedience: Sherry passed out steward schedules and a job description.

Alicia Graybill is the new GLOC webmaster. She will be working to update the website.

We still need an awards chairperson. Award forms need to be sent in by November 15. Awards will be handed out at the December potluck meeting. New people will receive a plaque and their dogs will receive a dangle with titles showing. These must be in as soon as possible so we can get this information to the maker. The form is in the September and October issues of the Barker.

There will be a United Kennel Club obedience show on April 14th & 15th. Vince Kamrath is the chairperson and Vicky Graybill is the Event Secretary. Thanks to Jennifer for helping us to get this going. A UKC Agility trial will be held the last weekend in January. Please contact Alicia Graybill or Jayne Sebbly about this. We will need stewards for both shows. Please sign up. Also, there will be a raffle fundraiser at the trial; please donate by contacting the above people.

There will be a United Kennel Club registration time. Alicia Graybill will be at the club to hold a registration sign up. She will help with the paperwork and take pictures for your registration. This will be on November 11, 2007, at 1 p.m. so please come if you have questions or need help to register your dog.

Remember there are obedience show-and-goes on the third Friday of each month and agility show-and-goes be on the fourth Friday. Agility show-and-goes will not be held in November and December. The last agility show-and-go for 2006 will be October 20th. The first agility show and-go for 2007 will be January 5, 2007, by UKC rules. Please help out with these also.

The open house was a great success. There was a slide show of the open house set up by Noelle Sheridan. Thanks, Noelle.

A talk was given by Mary Mulligan of Pet Partners on therapy dogs.

I Need to Choose a Dog Breed--HELP!

Ever had a friend or relative ask you what kind of dog they should get? For some of us, the first instinct is to advise them to get the same kind of dog we have. That can be disastrous, though. A frail neighbor with a boisterous Siberian Husky could even lead to a hospitalization! So what should you do? You might refer them to some books from the local public library.

The Complete Dog Book by the AKC- A comprehensive collection of the breed standards for all the 140+ dog breeds recognized by the American Kennel Club. It's a good overview of the various breeds but it makes all of them sound like perfect pets for everyone. Most of this information is also available at the AKC web site <http://www.akc.org>.

The Right Dog for You by Daniel Tortora- An older book that can be hard to locate. Tortora was an animal behaviorist who pulled his conclusions from the actual dogs he worked with. Not all recognized breeds are covered, unfortunately, and some breed clubs have taken steps to counter some of the problems Tortora mentioned about their breeds but it still is a valuable resource for breeds with longstanding recognition like Labs and German Shepherds.

Paws to Consider by Brian Kilcommons and Sara Wilson- Kilcommons and Wilson are professional dog trainers in New York City who have appeared on television multiple times. They have together written multiple books about dogs, including the laugh-out-loud anecdote-filled *Tails from the Bark Side*. They have divided the various breeds into groups like "Fine for Apartment Dwellers" and "Not for Everyone" based on their own experiences with literally thousands of dogs of all breeds. Not only is this a great resource but it also is entertaining to read.

Your Purebred Puppy: A Buyer's Guide by Michelle Lowell- One of the first of the more recent crop of dog breed selection books, Lowell's book starts out with a "self-test" that allows people to assess their own lifestyle to see how active they are, how much grooming they want to do, how much training they're willing to put into the dog, and other factors in the selection of a dog. Unlike Kilcommons and Wilson, she has the breeds divided into the AKC groups for ease of reference. She does give a rating for each dog breed on things like "Grooming Ease," "Indoor Activity Level," "Trainability," "Friendliness with Strangers," among others. A good resource though the older editions are a little out of date.

G.L.O.C. buys a plaque for members when they obtain their first title. The plaque typically will have the member's name, and the name of their dogs and titles earned are attached to the plaque with dangles. The plaques read "G.L.O.C. Honors _____". If you are getting a plaque this year, how do you want your name and/or your kennel name (if desired) to read?

GLOC pays for **one dangle per dog per year** for any dog owned or co-owned by a club member that completes a breed championship, obedience title, herding title, tracking title, agility title, hunting title, Schutzhund title, flyball title and/or Canine Good Citizen award.

To receive awards for dogs bred by club members, but not owned or co-owned by club members, the club member must pay the full cost of the award. Co-owned dogs cannot compete for club awards unless trained by the club member. Also, if club members wish to receive a separate dangle for each title a dog earns, they must pay the cost of each additional dangle. (Dangles cost approximately \$5 each, plaques \$40.)

If a club member does not wish to receive any dangles or plaques, please include a note to that effect with this form and the member's accomplishments will still be announced at the Annual Banquet. The Board also wishes you to note that donations to offset the cost of dangles and plaques are very welcome.

Please print the full name and title(s) of each dogs you wish for them to appear on each dangle. If you wish to receive more dangles than the one per dog per year for which the club pays, then please list how you wish to have each dangle engraved.
