Board Meeting Minutes -- November 4, 2004**

Present: Judy Vitamvas, Vince Kamrath, Elbert Traylor, Nancy Bowen, Jennifer Brown, Beverly McGhghy, and Stefanie Bowers

Minutes: The October Board minutes were approved as written

Treasurer's Report: See elsewhere in this issue of The Barker.

Lancaster Event Center: The bill for use of the Lancaster Event Center for the October Agility and Obedience Trials has been received and paid. There were some discrepancies, some of which were resolved and some which were not.

Nominating Committee: The Nominating Committee met and submitted names for the 2005 GLOC Board Officers. Nominations will also be accepted from the floor at the meeting. Nominees must be present to accept the nomination or must have a written statement saying they have no objection to being nominated and they will serve in the office for which they were nominated, if elected.

Agility:

April 2005 Trial: The April Agility trial has been approved by AKC. A contract was recently mailed to the agility judge.

October 2004 Trial: Paperwork submitted to AKC has been approved and this trial has now been closed out by the AKC.

Agility Equipment: A motion was made and approved to authorize \$500 for improvement and/or replacement of some of the deteriorating agility equipment. Parts of the dog walk and A-frame, in particular, need replacement. The agility committee will determine priority needs for this expenditure.

Building Space in State Fair Park: The GLOC Board voted and approved a month-to-month contract with the State Fair for space for \$175 per month. This building is not heated, does not have heat or air conditioning, nor running water or bathrooms, but it is approximately 110 feet x 40 feet. Restrooms are available in another building. Agility classes and agility practices will be held in this building. It will not be available during the summer. It is anticipated that class fees will cover the cost of the building. It is also large enough to have obedience fun matches (and flyball???) in the spring. The building is not available during the summer and we would need to be out by July 1, 2004.

(Possibility of) New Building Committee: There was further discussion as to consideration of a church building which is available in Havelock. Elbert will follow-up with Dave Hayes to determine if a visit had been made by a contractor/engineer to check the heating, electrical, etc., and determine if the repairs needed for the building might be too costly.

Present Building:

Golden Retriever Rescue in Nebraska (GRRIN) has requested use of the GLOC building on a Sunday afternoon for their annual meeting. This was approved by the Board. When the date of the GRINN annual meeting is finalized, it will be posted at the building (and published in the Barker if time permits).

Dues: Vicky Graybill is working on sending out postcards reminding members that dues are due by December 31, 2004. Dues are \$20 for individuals and \$25 for families. There was some discussion about raising the dues. It was decided not to raise the dues for 2005, but the issue will be reviewed again in June 2005 for the final decision as to an increase for 2006 dues.

Training:

Agility: Elbert talked with Southeast Community College about the use of one of the baseball fields for agility. The person he spoke with will have to check further for a decision, but it did not sound like it would be a favorable decision.

Puppy Class: It appears Southeast Community College overcharged one of the puppy class attendees; they were charged at the Basic Class rate rather than at the Puppy Class rate. A refund will be made by the GLOC Treasurer to the individual.

Treasurer's Report. See elsewhere in this issue of The Barker.

Correspondence: A flyer regarding some international shows (such as Crufts) was described and circulated.

Training: All fall classes are full. The January schedule will be printed in the Barker.

Public Relations – Star City Parade: Stefanie Bower has been collecting red sweatshirts so the decorations can be stitched on. The parade is December 4th (the first Saturday in December). Jerry Harder will have a wagon pulled by a pair of dogs and Jennifer Brown will have a wagon pulled by a pair of dogs. Parade practices will be held on the next two Sundays at 1 p.m. at Uni Park. (Note: The 2nd session was later changed to the State Fair Park)

Agility Trials:

April 2005 Trial: The April Agility trial has been approved by AKC. A contract was recently mailed to the agility judge.

October 2004 Trial: Paperwork submitted to AKC has been approved and this trial has now been closed out by the AKC.

Obedience Trials:

Entry Fees: AKC has raised the recording fee for each dog entered in obedience from \$.50 to \$2.00. Rally Obedience, which becomes a titling class in 2005, will have a \$5.00 per dog recording fee. In order to help offset some of this additional cost, a motion was made and approved to raise the 2005 obedience entry fees to \$25 for the first entry and \$20 for the second entry of the same dog.

Judges: Judges have been lined up for the 2005 Obedience Trial (Harold and Rose Doane), and judges for the 2006 Obedience Trial will soon be contacted.

Building Space in State Fair Park: The GLOC Board voted and approved a month-to-month contract with the State Fair for space for \$175 per month. This building is not heated, does not have heat or air conditioning, nor running water or bathrooms, but it is approximately 110 feet x 40 feet. Restrooms are available in another building. Agility classes and agility practices will be held in this building. It will not be available during the summer. It is anticipated that class fees will cover the cost of the building. The input of members is requested to assist in selection of recipients for the following awards: TWIG Award, Golden Bolt Award, Cleared Hurdle Award, Glenfields Black Star Award, and GLOC Outstanding Club Service Award. These are all award plaques of honor which stay in the GLOC building and has a name added each year. Descriptions of these awards and a nomination form appear elsewhere in the Barker.

NEW AGILITY CLASSES AND TRAINING

We have rented the Food Court building at the Fair Grounds for winter agility practices and classes. The equipment will be in the building and large pieces are set up. Keys are limited so for the time, anyone who wants to practice during the week should contact Jane Sebby, Donna Bundy, Mary Schweitzer, Elbert Traylor, or Judy Vitamvas.

The classes listed below focus on handling skills and mastering specific obstacles rather than running courses. There will be open practices sessions (Sundays at 3:00 PM) for running courses. For the time being, all registrations are being done through Elbert Traylor (435-7886) rather than SCC.

Introduction to Agility (4 Weeks, \$25, Limited to 12 students). Wednesday, 1 December, 7:00 PM, taught by Jane Sebby

Class will focus on safety, familiarization with contacts and obstacles, introduction of handling skills and rules of competition.

Beginning Agility (8 Weeks, \$50, Limited to 12 students). Wednesday, 8 December, 8:00 PM, taught by Jane Sebby

Class will focus on basic handling skills, mastery of individual contacts and obstacles and mastery of simple patterns (pre-novice/novice).

Advanced Agility (10 Weeks, \$60, Limited to 12 students). Tuesday, 30 November, 8:00 PM, taught by Mary Schweitzer

Class will focus on advanced handling skills and mastery of complex patterns (advanced novice-excellent). This class will run continuously, and students will have four months to use their 10 classes.

G.L.O.C. buys a plaque for members when they obtain their first title. The plaque typically will have the member=s name, and the name of their dogs and titles earned are attached to the plaque with dangles. The plaques read "G.L.O.C. Honors _____". If you are getting a plaque this year, how do you want your name and/or your kennel name (if desired) to read?

GLOC pays for **one dangle per dog per year** for any dog owned or co-owned by a club member that completes a breed championship, obedience title, herding title, tracking title, agility title, hunting title, Schutzhund title, flyball title and/or Canine Good Citizen award.

To receive awards for dogs bred by club members, but not owned or co-owned by club members, the club member must pay the full cost of the award. Co-owned dogs can not compete for club awards unless trained by the club member. Also, if club members wish to receive a separate dangle for each title a dog earns, they must pay the cost of each additional dangle. (Dangles cost approximately \$5 each, plaques \$40.)

If a club member does not wish to receive any dangles or plaques, please include a note to that effect with this form and the member's accomplishments will still be announced at the Annual Banquet. The Board also wishes you to note that donations to offset the cost of dangles and plaques are very welcome.

Please print the full name and title(s) of each dog as you wish for them to appear on each dangle. If you wish to receive more dangles than the one per dog per year for which the club pays, then please list how you wish to have each dangle engraved.
