GLOC buys a plaque for members when they obtain their first title. The plaque typically will have the member's name, and the name of their dogs and titles earned are attached to the plaque with dang-les. The plaques read "G.L.O.C. Honors _____". **If you are getting a plaque this year**, how do you want your name and/or your kennel name (if desired) to read?

GLOC pays for **one dangle per dog per year** for any dog owned or co-owned by a club member that completes a breed championship, or earns a title in obedience, tracking, agility, hunting, Schutzhund, flyball and/or Canine Good Citizen award.

To receive awards for dogs bred or trained by club members, but not owned or co-owned by club mem-bers, the club member must pay for the full cost of the award. Co-owned dogs cannot compete for club awards unless trained by the club member. Also, if club members wish to receive a separate dangle for each title a dog earns, they must pay the cost of each additional dangle. (Dangles cost approximately \$10 each, plaques \$60)

Please print the full name and titles of each dog as you wish for them to appear on each dangle. If you wish to receive more dangles than the one per dog per year for which the club pays, then please list how you wish to have each dangle engraved. **Please Print Clearly**

AWARD INFORMATION

Each year in February we have an Awards ceremony to reward those members who compete with their dogs and the Outstanding Service Award for a member who donates a lot of time to the club. Here are the awards:

OUTSTANDING SERVICE AWARD

The Outstanding Service Award was awarded for the first time in 1994. This award recognizes a member's hard work and dedication to the club. In 2006 it was changed to have Club members vote on this award. Voting will take place by secret ballot.

TWIG AWARD

The "Repeat Performance" award! Please submit the number of entries you have paid for in one class at competition obedience events. Members must nominate themselves.

BLACK STAR

For the most improved dog in obedience. This award will be voted on by the Obedience Instructors

GOLDEN BOLT

For the dog that succeeds in spite of itself! This award is for dogs who have earned a title in spite of itself. The award will be voted on by the Board of Directors.

MOST IMPROVED AGILITY DOG

Most Improved Agility Dog: For the dog and handler that have improved the most throughout that year - either in class or at trials or both. Nominated by and voted on by the Agility trainers that are currently teaching a class.

CLEARED HURDLE AWARD

This is an award for the Agility dog and trainer that have overcome the most obstacles in the past year. This award will be voted on by the Agility trainers that are currently teaching a class.

COURSE DESIGNER:

For the dog that likes to design their own course (comparable to the Golden Bolt). Nominated by and voted on by the Agility Instructors that are currently teaching a class.

TOP AGILITY DOG

Agility competitor receiving the most titles in the past year, taking into consideration the highest title earned and who is the overall hands down the top agility team

TOP COMPETITION DOG; TOP UTILITY DOG, TOP OPEN DOG; TOP NOVICE DOG AND TOP RALLY DOG

Are all based upon the scores that are submitted. The scores will be averaged and the dog with the highest average will be awarded the "TOP" dog award.

HERSHEY AWARD

For the most improved Flyball dog. Nominated and voted on by the Flyball instructors/team.

GLOC VERSATILITY AWARD

The Lucy Rolinc Award was retired and a new "Versatility" award for a dog and handler team was started in 2007. This award is to honor the dog and handler team that receives a title in any two of the following disciplines that GLOC promotes: Obedience, Agility, Tracking, Rally Obedience, and/or Breed.

Titles may be obtained using either UKC or AKC rules. Scores must be earned between January 1st and December 31st each year. Qualifying scores must be submitted to the Awards Chairperson by the awards deadline of the January meeting unless the Awards Chair changes the date as published.
